All Trilennium locks are typically handed for inswing applications when they are shipped. When being used on a outswing door, you must use the opposite hand lock and reverse the Panic Release feature.



Trilennium locks can only be re-handed from right hand inswing to left hand reverse and from left hand inswing to right hand reverse.


1. Part identification


There is one component that creates the panic release feature on the interior of the Trilennium mortise lock. The **long** drive arm is for the <u>interior</u>, the **short** drive arm for the <u>exterior</u>.



2b. Twist to remove

One edge is under the "I" beam, so twist it to the side slightly.





2a. Remove plastic covers

The black plastic rehanding covers are removable. Depress the snap lock using a fingernail and lift the cover out.



3. Reverse arms

Once you have removed both plastic covers, reverse the drive arms. Reference 2nd page for correct placement. Reinstall the covers.







